SHARE KNOW YOUR RIGHTS WITH IMMIGRATION FLYERS



*Immigrant community members knowing their rights with immigration enforcement is the first line of deportation defense. Our Know Your Rights with Immigration flyers are available in 18 languages. FORM A RAPID RESPONSE TEAM



*Rapid Response Teams are groups of trained individuals who are activated to document and provide support to affected families when activity, raids, or detentions by immigration agents are reported in their community. **Trainings are online and you can join alone or host a watch party!***

*Volunteers walk side by side with immigrant community members at court hearings, immigration appointments, and other locations where community members are vulnerable to harmful immigration enforcement activities. **Trainings are online.***
